## 2017 IAD and IRID Conference

## **Conference Highlights**

The four-day conference highlighted improving communication access, fostering client/interpreter relationships, and enabling collaboration between the Deaf and Interpreting communities.

- Keynote presenter was Howard Rosenblum, CEO of NAD, who presented "Advocacy, Bridges, and Communication: A Roadmap to Success."
- Plenary speaker was Ryan Commerson. Ryan presented "Deconstructing Disabilities."
- There were a number of additional workshops, allowing deaf individuals and interpreters to share their experiences and perspectives.
- A handful of well-known sponsors and vendors such as Illinois School for the Deaf (ISD), CHS (Chicago Hearing Society), CAIRS, Sorenson, DEAF Inc., Purple, Interpretek, Morgan Stanley and Vineya were present to showcase their products/services and answer questions.

days.













 On the last day of the conference, the newly elected IAD Officers and Board Members met to discuss the newly identified priorities voted on by the members. The 2017-2019 priorities are as follows:

#### 1) Education Strategy Team

IAD shall have an Education Strategy Team consisting of key stakeholders (e.g., teachers, interpreters, Deaf, Hard of Hearing and DeafBlind, and parents) to identify the top issues in Deaf Education in Illinois, conduct outreach to solicit feedback from the community and determine a course of action pertaining to deaf education reform, including a Deaf Child Bill of Rights and promotion of bilingual education.

#### 2) Illinois Deaf Alliance

IAD shall take the lead in establishing an alliance of organizations serving individuals who are Deaf, Hard of Hearing and/or DeafBlind.

#### 3) Captioning in all Public Places

IAD shall develop a task force to develop recommendations for proceeding with legislative action to mandate captioning in all public places in Illinois.

#### 4) Interpreting Rules and Regulations

IAD shall collaborate with the Illinois Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (IRID) to develop comprehensive recommendations for interpreting rules and regulations.

# 5) Establish a Jr. IAD Program

IAD shall establish a formal Jr. IAD program.
